





THE BABY-SITTERS' CLUB: KRISTY'S GREAT IDEA by Ann M. Martin




DORK DIARIES: POP STAR by Rachel Renee Russell

EVER AFTER HIGH: THE STORYBOOK OF LEGENDS by Shannon Hale




THE LOST AND FOUND: LOVE FROM LEXIE by Cathy Cassidy
